MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING OF THE AAVSO HELD AT THE ALTAMONTE SPRINGS INN AND RACQUET CLUB ALTAMONTE SPRINGS (ORLANDO), FLORIDA MAY 26-27, 1979

The Saturday morning AAVSO business session was called to order by President Marvin Baldwin at 9:15 AM. Mr. Charles Cole, President of the Central Florida Astronomical Society, welcomed the AAVSO to the Orlando area, and Secretary C. B. Ford summarized the minutes of the October, 1978, General AAVSO Meetings, which were approved.

In the absence of the Treasurer, his Interim Report for the six months ending March 31, 1979, was read by the Secretary. The details of this report appear elsewhere in this issue of JAAV \underline{SO} .

The AAVSO Director, Mrs. Janet Mattei, read a list of 151 new memberships approved by the Council at its meeting on May 25, 1979. Of these, 64 were new to the Association, and 87 were changing from existing annual to sustaining membership. The Director then announced the names of 5 members deceased since October, 1978: Messrs. H. Beidler, J. Ruiz, and D. Taboada; Miss Margaret Harwood and Mrs. Walter Reeves. Members stood in respect for a moment of silence.

The President called for Committee Reports, and the following were duly presented and discussed. These reports appear separately in this issue of the Journal.

These nominations were approved by general vote.

Mrs. Mattei then presented her Director's Interim Report for the period ending March 31, 1979. Highlights included:

- (1) A grant has been made from NASA in recognition of the AAVSO's contributions to the HEAO x-ray satellite programs; \$5800 due to be received in October 1979.
- (2) Observation key-punching at HQ is now up to date; two new CETA workers hired, thanks to a new C. B. Ford Grant.
- (3) Publication of observations in Reports nos. 38 and 39 has been further delayed due to changes in the computer system at Harvard Observatory.
- (4) A part-time corresponding secretary has been hired and is making good progress on the backlog of the Director's correspondence.
- (5) The discovery by member Gus Johnson of a Supernova in M100.
- (6) The generous bequest of \$5000 soon to be received by AAVSO from the estate of deceased member Herbert Beidler of Chicago.
- (7) The current status of the Director's grant request to

NSF, to cover publication of observations from 1963 thru 1977 (which is apparently receiving favorable consideration).

This report was applauded, and the meeting was opened for papers at 11:30 AM. Those numbered 1 and 2 on the following list were given before adjourning for lunch at 12:15 PM.

The Saturday afternoon session convened at 2:05 PM. President Baldwin briefly introduced Past-President Cyrus F. Fernald and Mrs. Fernald, who were present for a limited time only. Mr. Fernald read his paper on the history of his 8-inch Springfield telescope which has recently been donated to the Central Florida Astronomical Society. He also reviewed statistics regarding the variable star observations he has made over the past 40 years: 118,551 with this 8-inch in Maine, plus over 15,000 with various instruments since he moved to Florida about 1960.

Mr. Fernald's talk was followed by the awarding of a special plaque to the CFAS President, Mr. Cole, on behalf of both the AAVSO and Mr. Fernald, this plaque to be mounted on the 8-inch as currently installed at its new location, about 25 miles east of Orlando.

A group photograph, including the Fernalds, was taken outside the meeting auditorium, before the meeting re-convened for continuation of the papers session. Papers numbered 3 through 10 on the following list were duly presented and discussed. Some abstracts and full texts or these papers appear elsewhere in this issue of <u>JAAVSO</u>. The Saturday afternoon session adjourned at 5:20 PM.

The scheduled banquet on Saturday night was attended by nearly 100 people, and the speaker, Dr. Alex Smith from the University of Florida, presented an excellent illustrated talk on Quasars which provoked an active question-answer period lasting until about 11:30 PM. On Sunday morning, May 27, a busload assembled for the scheduled trip to the 8-inch Springfield's new site, where the awarded plaque was temporarily installed during dedication ceremonies. Members and guests also inspected other observing equipment of the CFAS located at the site.

A visit to Cape Kennedy Space Center, which consumed the balance of the day, was very well organized and was of great interest to all.
